No Cross Entering Divisions - Open Classes are offered in good sportsmanship and open to all. These classes enable riders to work out a problem and have the opportunity to try the next level of skill without interfering with points in other divisions.

Open Divisions - May enter any appropriate

Contest Divisions - Choose One, open to riders showing any seat

Trot Crossrails - Open to all riders in 10 & Under and Novice divisions only. English tack and helmets required.

Classes for division - 14, 15

Youth Crossrail Hunter - Open to riders ages 11-17. English tack and helmets required. Classes for division - 16, 17

Adult Crossrail Hunter - Open to riders 18+. English tack and helmets required. Classes for division - 18, 19

Hunter - Open to riders in English tack. Helmets required. Classes for division - 20, 21, 22 *or* 23

Sport Horse - This division is designed to show the movement and versatility of equine suited for equestrian sporting events - dressage, eventing and show jumping. Hunter or Dressage attire and helmets required. Classes for division - 44, 45, 46

Lead Line Contest - Open to riders age 8 and under who are not yet riding independently. *W/T only*

Classes for division - 52, 56, 60, 64, 68

Beginner Contest - Open to riders any age in their first two years of riding. *W/T only* Classes for division - 53, 57, 61, 65, 69

Youth Contest - Open to riders age 17 and younger.

Classes for division— 54, 58, 62, 66, 70

Adult Contest - Open to riders age 18 and older.

Classes for division - 55, 59, 63, 67, 71

+Beginner Division classes are offered in good sportsmanship and are open to **riders in their first or second year of showing**. Beginner Divisions are walk/trot/jog, riders may not cross enter into Pleasure Divisions that canter/lope. Riders may enter Open Hunter or Open Sport Horse divisions to stretch their skills at the next level.

Day End High Point

Day End High Point Division Awards - Competitors may show:

- ONE Pleasure Division (See choices in chart above)
- ONE Contest Division (See choices in chart above)
- Any appropriate OPEN division (See choices in chart above)

Year - End Member Awards

WRC Year-End Member Division Awards - WRC Club members are eligible for one pleasure, one contest and any of the appropriate open division awards. The points collected in classes entered in the selected division plus a point for every class entered in are included for the divisional awards.

WRC Member Overall Year-End Awards - WRC Club members have an opportunity to collect points for high point overall awards. Points are accumulated as a horse/rider combination. Points are earned in each class of a WRC show plus one point for every class entered.

Membership - Membership forms can be found on the website and in the show office. Member points are kept on horse/rider combination for each show. Points for Member Awards count start to accumulate after membership is submitted. Any points earned prior to submission will not count toward Member High Point Awards; be sure to submit membership application before your first show in order to be eligible for Member Year-End Awards. 3 hours of volunteer work, per rider earning points, is required to be eligible to earn Member Awards. It is your responsibility to ensure your volunteer hours are completed and submitted to the show office by the completion of the final show of the season. Awards will be presented to members in good standing at the year-end awards banquet.

Required documents

- Current negative coggins and proof of rabies vaccine if required for a horse to be on the showgrounds. Once submitted, these will be kept on file for future shows.
- Proof of membership or membership application, complete with payment
- Registration form is required for each horse/rider combination. This is used to track division awards and payment.
- Individual class slips are required. Office Staff will cut them apart at check in.

General Rules

1. Signed waivers must be on file with the show secretary prior to schooling. Youth riders must have a signed waiver by parent or guardian in order to school or show. Back numbers must be worn at all times. All ages are as of 12/1/23
2. Adding classes must be done a minimum of 2 classes in advance. Add forms must be used.
3. No refunds for scratched or missed classes. Notify the office immediately in the event of illness of injury or a horse or rider.
4. Contest attire: Riders must wear long pants, shirt with a sleeve (short sleeves are acceptable, tank tops are not) and riding shoes/boots with a heel.
5. Show attire is expected for pleasure divisions. Judge will not disqualify rider for lack of appointments but may deduct points.
6. Timed Events: Riders must wait until the gate is closed to begin their run. Running the gate will result in disqualification. Horse must be back to a walk before being allowed to exit the ring.
7. Cancellation of classes - Under circumstances deemed unsafe by show committee, a class may be postponed to a later date or cancelled. Shows will run rain or shine. In the event of lightning, the show manager will call a halt to the show. A 30 minute hold time is required after lightning is observed. The show committee will determine whether to continue the show or delay an additional length of time. Delay may be up to a total of 2 hours. In the event of cancellation, exhibitors will have the opportunity to be refunded for the classes they could not compete in. If the exhibitor can attend a rain date, the fees and paperwork can be held over.
8. Conduct Expectations of competitors - WRC shows are meant to be a fun, family oriented and competitive environment for riders to demonstrate their horsemanship skills. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated by competitors, trainers, parents and/or spectators. This includes but is not limited to the mishandling of an equine and unacceptable language. If unsportsmanlike conduct is observed, the violator will be asked to leave the grounds and any and all entry fee will be forfeited. Trainers, parents and spectators displaying such behavior will be asked to vacate the premises.
9. NO SMOKING within 50ft of the show ring or any buildings on the showgrounds.
10. Do not leave children unattended on the bleachers, in the clubhouse or the bathroom. This is unsafe for both the children and any riders in the ring. Anyone making a disturbance will be asked to leave the ringside.
11. If classes are being judged as an open card (ex. Showmanship, over fences, contest, etc) and no one is waiting in line, an order of go will be given.
12. Classes will run on a 2 minute gate call. No refunds for missed classes.
13. Show management reserves the right to combine or cancel any classes with low entries and change the order of classes to help continue progression through the show.
14. The judge's decision is final.

Points Schedule: 1st place = 6 pts 2nd place = 5 pts 3rd place = 4 pts 4th place = 3pts 5th place = 2 pts 6th place = 1pt

Ties within a division will be determined by most blue ribbons won, red ribbons won through most green ribbons won respectively. The horse & rider with the highest points at the end of the show will be the division champion. Ribbons will be awarded through 6th place. Show committee has the right to combine classes with less than 4 entries.
